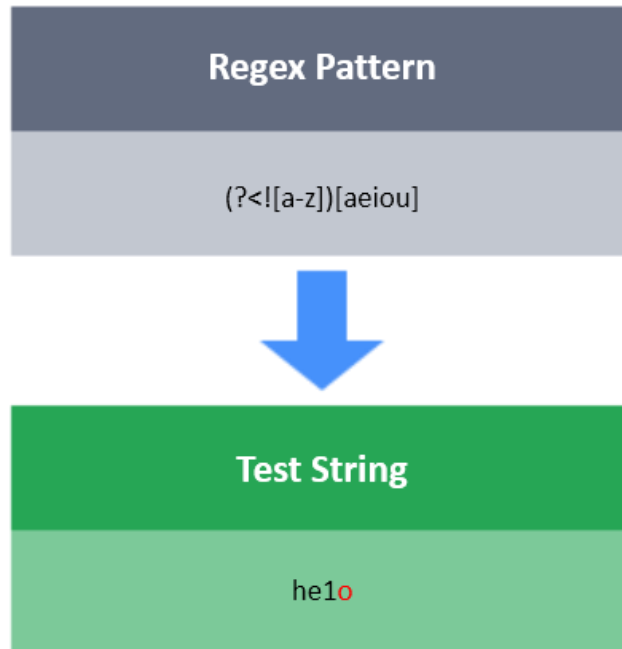


Negative Lookbehind

`(?<!regex_2)regex_1`

The negative lookbehind (`?<!`) asserts `regex_1` *not* to be immediately preceded by `regex_2`. Lookbehind is excluded from the match (do not consume matches of `regex_2`), but only assert whether a match is possible or not.



In above image Regex Pattern is matched with the Test String.

Task

You have a test String *S*.

Write a regex which can match all the occurrences of characters which are not immediately preceded by vowels (a, e, i, u, o, A, E, I, O, U).

Note

This is a regex only challenge. You are not required to write a code.

You have to fill the regex pattern in the blank ().

JavaScript do not support lookbehind.
